MFL Non-Negotiables

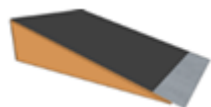
Classroom Non-Negotiables:

Responding to the afternoon register in French.
Using simple greetings (Bonjour, Au revoir).
A timetabled slot dedicated to French each week.

High-Quality MFL Lessons:

Teachers have access to Language Angels as a scheme to ensure structured learning.
Clear sound bites are used to help teachers and pupils pronounce words accurately.
Engaging images are used to support vocabulary learning.
Songs linked to topics help consolidate key vocabulary.

Lessons include listening, speaking, reading, and writing opportunities to ensure well-rounded language development.

- Use visuals, gestures, and real-life objects to aid understanding.
- Break learning into small steps and reinforce key vocabulary.
- Provide sentence stems and modelled examples for speaking and writing.
- Use songs, rhymes, and role-play to build confidence.
- Display key vocabulary and encourage Talking Partners.
- Support speech and language needs with visual prompts and structured sentences.
- Foster a supportive environment where mistakes are part of learning.
- Use group activities and predictable lesson structures to reduce anxiety.
- Offer alternative ways to participate, such as using flashcards.
- Provide sound bites, larger print, and visual aids for accessibility.
- Use movement-based learning (e.g., gestures, role-play).
- Adapt writing tasks with ICT support if needed.

Resources to Support Learning:

Clear vocabulary labels on objects and displays to allow children to revisit learned words.
Where possible, physical objects are used to create real-life connections.
